The memory of recent trauma differs from that of a more distant trauma in that it tends to be more fragmented or unconsolidated and less integrated into a coherent, narrative sequence of events or theme cluster (Shapiro, Francine, 2001) (Shapiro, Elan, 2008). Several EEI protocols will be reviewed, and a practicum will allow the participants to learn by doing!

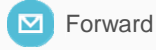
